SOCIAL STUDIES	B	<p>It would appear that [REDACTED] has tried to improve her disposition and often refrains from outbursts of malignment. She is beginning to become more responsible for misconducts which still persist and has become quite contrite for many of them.</p> <p>We should encourage her to refrain from substituting a task with her own brand of work which may be anything from sewing to "messages" or clippings of magazines when required to complete a lesson in Arithmetic or Reading. Much of her time, if permitted, would not be employed usefully in the continuity of each subject. When this is pointed out to her, we often endure a flare of temper and abusive language.</p> <p>She should be encouraged to respect and leave alone the property of others. She should be encouraged to tell the truth while learning to do this.</p> <p>There are signs of her learning to get along more amicably with the others, though she still needs to learn the pattern expected of more mature students.</p>

When she realizes what is expected in her behaviour, her progress should show some improvement.</p>

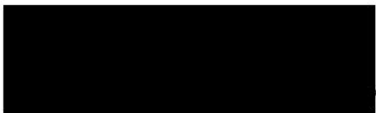
