Dear Sir:

We have had a call to-day from [redacted] of [redacted] Toronto, who states that he is the father of the patient [redacted] admitted to Orillia Hospital on November 7, 1926. Mr. [redacted] presented the picture of the patient and stated that she is twenty-one years of age and had obtained some skill in dressmaking. He also presented a letter signed by Mrs. [redacted] Toronto, who knows [redacted] and who conducts three stores in Toronto and owns each of them. At these stores the business of Millinery and Dressmaking is carried on, and if [redacted] is in a fit condition to be discharged she can supply her with work and take her into her own family. It is stated that the offer is an altruistic one, and that Mrs. [redacted] interest is entirely unselfish. You might let me have your opinion as to the merits of this application. Her father states that he proposes making a visit to Orillia on the 11th of this month and would like to bring the girl back with him.
