PURPOSE OF VISIT:

A visit with (sister) at her home in Orillia, on June 21, 1996 was arranged by this writer to update family on progress is making and to update family information for our files. After not having seen for many years had visited recently at the Centre, once at her fathers request after being informed that had broken his nose during a seizure and once on her own initiative. During these visits, she had inquired about the program is involved in and a referral to Social Work for a family update was made.

During the visit general information concerning residential unit, day program and health was conveyed. It was noted that he required assistance with most areas of daily living, attends half day Block Program and remains healthy. Seizures are stable at 8 to 12 per year. He is generally even tempered and tends to sit quietly on his own during leisure hours.

FAMILY RESPONSE TO PLACEMENT:

Placement in York Region would likely be best as father and some siblings continue to reside in that area.

At this point [REDACTED] is interested in getting to know [REDACTED] better leading to the possibility of more frequent visits with him at HRC. It was briefly discussed that for purposes of convenience and to have [REDACTED] better prepared of a visit, staff should be advised.
