FAMILY SITUATION:

Maternal Grandparents - Wm. [REDACTED] - casual labourer, below normal mentally, excessive drinker, deserted family.  
[REDACTED] - charwoman, below normal mentally, remarried.  
- all maternal relatives stated to be mentally subnormal.  
- family involved with Welfare agencies since 1916.

Mother - [REDACTED] age 60  
- was at O.H.S. Orillia from 1926 - 1937.  
I.Q. = 52. discharged through the [REDACTED] Toronto.  
- married Mr. [REDACTED] - reported to have divorced him.  
- married Mr. [REDACTED] 20 years her junior.  
- simple, immature, looks younger than she is.

Father - [REDACTED] age 40  
- has been truck driver and labourer, had refused to provide for family in past.  
- worked nights this past winter.  
- [REDACTED]  
- seemed uninterested in what happened to [REDACTED] would not talk to social worker.

Siblings - [REDACTED] is youngest of Mrs. [REDACTED] 8 children  
- 6 half-siblings from 1st. marriage.

- half-brothers - [REDACTED] - [REDACTED]  
- took [REDACTED] out overnight July 9, 1968 to his boarding house.  
- returned by Mrs. [REDACTED] former sponsor.

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- half-brother - [redacted]
    - called on April 13, 1969 to take [redacted] into Orillia.
    - Miss [redacted] said he could only visit her on ward (she is certified) and he seemed to lose interest in visiting under these conditions.)
  
  - family had lived on [redacted], Toronto but were relocated (due to urban redevelopment) in [redacted]
  - Reforms Institutions Dept. involved with family since 1958.
    - children poorly cared for
    - mother protected children and covered up their delinquencies
  - home is a neat and tidy cottage - very small, shabbily furnished.
  - there is no consistent discipline or guidance in the home
- 1. [redacted]: prior to discharge from Orillia:
- admitted here from O.T.S. Galt (charged with break, entry and theft.)
  - had become ineligible for full-day academic school
  - last school report - June, 1968:
    - grade 3 reading and math.
    - grade 4 spelling
    - " 5 language
    - accepts advice well, believes she can do more advanced work.
  
  - Psychometric (1965)
    - Stanford - Binet I.Q. = 61
    - reasoning and vocabulary not bad
    - poor attention span.
  - looked sweet and innocent but trouble-maker
  - some homosexuality
  - temper tantrums, bad language
  - lies, lived in unreal world.
  - needed supervision.
- 2. [redacted] while on L.O.A. and discharged at home: (visited by Miss [redacted] Social Work Asst.)
- attended public school in [redacted] infrequently.
  - rumoured incidents of petty thieving
  - began occupations course at an [redacted] high school on trial basis.
    - personal adjustment poor
    - found excuses to miss classes
  - [redacted] said she hated her father and wasn't getting along at home. No reasons given.
  - Feb. 18, 1969 - reported that [redacted] had been involved with [redacted]
  - she said she was raped by [redacted] but her story varied.

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- police felt that [REDACTED] was promiscuous and invited sexual activity
- [REDACTED] had told police that [REDACTED] had raped her
- it was agreed that [REDACTED] should return to Orillia for her own protection.
- she was certified and returned to Orillia Feb. 25th. by Miss [REDACTED] and a police constable.

→ 3. [REDACTED] since re-admission

- [REDACTED] first came to the Medical Unit and then was moved to cottage M.
- she has stolen several articles from the other girls.
- she has written to her mother asking to return home and get married, The letter wasn't sent.
- she continues to lie and to manipulate staff and other residents.

[REDACTED] is an attractive girl without good reasoning ability and without good family background. Therefore, she is very vulnerable. At a recent medical conference, it was suggested that [REDACTED] be sterilized - to avoid increasing the burden on society.

It seems that she needs to be protected and supervised, and should not return to her family. At present, she is certified. [REDACTED] needs firm discipline and occupational training.
