[REDACTED] arrived home, but would not talk to us. She and I went outside for a walk. [REDACTED] revealed that when she had entered the house, she had been told not to say anything. However, she poured out her hatred for her father, and [REDACTED] and was upset over her experience with the [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was very defiant about not returning to OHSO.

February 24, 1969. Conversation with Constable [REDACTED] Whitechurch detachment:

The [REDACTED] family is well known to the police and have been called in on numerous occasions. [REDACTED] has told them that she has been raped by [REDACTED]. Constable [REDACTED] feels that [REDACTED] is promiscuous herself and has heard reports of [REDACTED] involving younger boys of the area in sexual activity. When he questioned one of the boys named by [REDACTED] over the February 18th incident, the lad was insistent that [REDACTED] asked for the intercourse.

At this point, the whole situation is fuzzy, but all involved have definite feelings that for her own protection, [REDACTED] should return to the Hospital School.

Dr. [REDACTED] at OHSO is willing to re-admit her and Dr. [REDACTED] will certify. Police Constable [REDACTED] will escort [REDACTED] and myself to the Hospital on February 25th.

February 25, 1969.

Dr. [REDACTED] Constable [REDACTED] and myself picked [REDACTED] up at the school. She was reluctant about coming with us, but did not put up a fight. Rather, she sat in the car and cried throughout the trip. Dr. [REDACTED] admitted her to Girls Hospital until a bed is available in M or the Residence. Miss [REDACTED] has been notified of [REDACTED] arrival and will pick up the case.
