The information asked for in the following questions should be given as fully as possible, going into careful detail in each instance. Where values are asked for give market values. This information is asked so as to enable the Public Trustee to ascertain the circumstances of the patient or his or her friends. Under 9 Geo. Cap. 32 the Public Trustee is the Statutory Committee of all Patients in residence in the Ontario Hospitals, and as such has full power to manage the estate of the Patient to the same extent as the Patient could if of sound mind. If the Patient is possessed of estate, no steps should be taken to dispose of same without authority from the Public Trustee. Owing to the extensive powers conferred on the Public Trustee by the Act, the economic management of the Patient's estate is assured, and the legal expenses which would be incurred by friends of the Patient in making application to the Court for the appointment of a Committee are avoided.

1. Is patient married or single? If married, give name and P. O. address of husband or wife. If single, give name of parents or nearest relatives and their P. O. address.

11. What disposition should be made of patient's property? Should present arrangements be continued or should property be leased or sold, taking into consideration the present requirements of the family, if any? When patient leaves Hospital the balance of the estate, after deducting patient's maintenance, will be returned to patient or patient's heirs.

MAINTENANCE—The minimum rate for which a patient shall be liable in the General Wards of any Provincial Hospital shall be \$7.00 per week, and in cases where the patient's condition calls for special care and treatment such further charges may be made as the Superintendent with the approval of the Deputy Provincial Secretary, shall determine.

The regulations of the Hospital provide that where the property of the patient is not sufficient to pay for his maintenance, it shall be the duty of the Superintendent and Bursar, before awarding admission to a patient, to obtain a bond from his father, mother or one or more responsible friends, guaranteeing to supply clothing and maintenance.

The maintenance bond in no way releases the patient's estate or any person or property legally liable to provide maintenance and clothing.

The regulations further provide that where a patient's condition requires special care and treatment, such additional charges may be made as may be determined by the Superintendent and the Deputy Provincial Secretary.

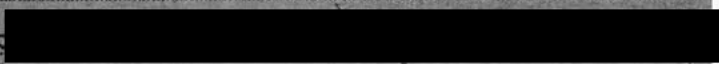
