SOCIAL WORK REPORT

On Sunday June 29th I received a call from the R.C. 4 on duty at Huronia Regional Centre. She told me that two people who claimed they were relatives of [redacted] one of our ex-residents, had phoned enquiring as to [redacted] whereabouts. They said they wished to pick up [redacted] to take her to a wedding and had lost her address. I informed the R.C. 4 that [redacted] was living in a community group home in Orillia and gave her the address. The R.C. 4 said she would screen the applicants if they arrived at Huronia Regional Centre to make sure whether they seemed to be reliable people who ought to have [redacted] address. Subsequently, I was in touch with the agency where [redacted] is living. We had several conversations about [redacted]. As it transpired this couple went to the Holiday Inn where [redacted] works and met [redacted] there. They did not come to Huronia Regional Centre. They took [redacted] away with them for a couple of days and she later phoned from Toronto saying that she was upset and wanted to come home immediately.

It transpired that these people were not relatives as they had claimed, but the girl was the former resident of Huronia Regional Centre, [redacted] has married a [redacted] but on this occasion the man in her company was a [redacted]. It appeared that they had taken [redacted] to their house in Toronto and offered her a job, although in fact, they did not seem to have the means of giving her a job. They wished her to leave Orillia<sup>and</sup> to live with them. Fortunately, it seems that [redacted]

[redacted] She returned to Orillia and the agency with whom she is living will try to ensure that [redacted] do not take [redacted] out again. [redacted] herself, is saying that she does not wish to see them again.

Looking through the file of [redacted] who was discharged from Orillia in 1971, I see that she has had a pattern of coming back here and to [redacted] Centre to visit residents who presumably were her friends while she was here. She seems to be an erratic and unreliable person.
